Biography

THE LATE ADWOA APASIWA AKUFFO
(AKA APASS, OSEKYE)

The late Madam Adwoa Apasiwa Akuffo, affectionately called Apess by relatives and friends, was born on 18th August, 1974 at Koforidua in the Eastern region. She was the second child of the late Ernest Sakyi Boafo Akuffo (Ahenenahene of Akuffo descendants) and Mrs. Elizabeth Akuffo (née Keelson).

During Apasiwa's early years, her parents were in London, U.K. She was left in the care of her dearest late Aunt whom she affectionately called Mama Mercy, and her beloved late grandmother, Madam Jane Quainoo. From the time she was little, Apess brought joy and laughter to those she came into contact with and she cherished her childhood memories of spending quality time with her siblings, cousins, grandparents and other loved ones.

Upon her parent's return from London, Apess began her primary education at Sunyani

Experimental School. The family soon moved to Accra where she briefly attended Premier Preparatory school. She was then transferred to Elta International school in Lartebikorshie, and finally completed her primary education at St. Martin de Porres School in Dansoman.

She continued her secondary education at Mfantsiman Girls School in Saltpond. During her time at Mfantsiman, her health took a downturn, and she was taken to London, U.K., where she received extensive medical care. She made a remarkable recovery by the Grace

of God and through her sheer tenacity and resilience. She returned to Ghana to continue her education.

At Mfantseman Girls School, Apess continued to face health challenges and after form three, she was transferred to Ebenezer Secondary school in Accra, where her mother was the Assistant Head Mistress. As she chose her subjects, she was the first and only student to enroll in typing at the certificate level, a subject she excelled at and clearly enjoyed. She completed form 5 with good grades that exceeded everyone's expectations.

Apess was very clever with excellent cognitive ability—a talent she used mostly for the benefit of others. She made friends easily wherever she went. She found joy in simple pleasures, whether it was initiating contact with family, friends and loved ones, praying with those

who need a little uplifting, or embarking on neighborhood walks to have friendly interactions with people.

Apess had an artistic flair and was very creative. She showed interest in various forms of art, including making costume jewelry and most importantly her complex riddles which she was widely known for. It was only natural that she would take up sewing. She attended Kalbs Sewing School where she specialized in embroidery and knitting.

Upon graduation from Kalbs, she worked at Barkus Fashions with her dear cousin Mrs. Barbara Akuffo Addo, before branching out on her own. Despite continued health issues, Apess persevered in her chosen field, with positive attitude and remained resolute in her ability to maintain her independence.

In addition to Apasiwa's endless abilities, she was a staunch member of the United Church, Teshi-Nungua Estates where she partook in various activities. She offered her unwavering support to the church, whenever an opportunity arose—a community she cherished very much.

By the beginning of April 2024, Apess had become very ill and was hospitalized at the Korle-bu Teaching Hospital. She begun to recover after a successful operation on 24th of

April, 2024. However, after a week or so, she started deteriorating rapidly. She took her last breath on 8th of May, 2024 at the Korle-bu Teaching Hospital.

Death has robbed us of a wonderful daughter, sister, aunt, niece, cousin and friend. Our beloved Apess, you fought a good fight till the end and your powerful prayers will always be remembered by your loved ones.

As we gather to honor Apasiwa's life and legacy, let us celebrate the profound impact she made on our lives and the countless memories that will forever be etched in our hearts.

Her willingness to help was boundless.

"Thank you, Madam President, for the program," she wrote. "Don't worry...if June ends and we still don't know what to do, then we will repeat it back for the last six months also." The message ended with a string of emojis conveying love, support, and unity—a perfect reflection of who she was.

The distance between us now makes showing love and support a painful reality. There are too many "what ifs" and "could haves" that linger. Apess, your genuine care for others left an indelible mark. Your radiant spirit and beautiful personality will be deeply missed.

Her positivity and her love for God was an inspiration to many of us. Apess possessed a unique ability to foster love and care within our group.

Her humorous riddles during some of the fellowship's programs as well as on WhatsApp, were a treat we delighted in solving while marveling at the unique way in which they were crafted. The riddles were simple yet profound, they showcased her sharp mind and a love for connection.

Apasiwa experienced some health related challenges over the past few years resulting in two major surgeries. While she triumphed over the first one in 2020, she succumbed in the

aftermath of the second one. Even when going through the treatment for her ailments, Apess remained stoic, forever putting the needs of others before herself.

The news of your passing, Apess, has left us in shock, we were so sure you would pull through. And were rehearsing our steps to meet you in Church and dance like David did. But as your life has taught us, even in grief, we find strength in unity. Today, we join hands to thank God for the privilege of knowing you. Your generosity, selflessness, and unapologetic faith in God are a legacy we will strive to carry forward. The memories we shared—your signature dancing in church, your comforting presence during hardships—will forever be etched in our hearts.
