
By the time he reached his latter teenage years, he took an interest in sports. He played basketball and football at Stilwell Middle School, and he continued to play both sports at Ed White High School.

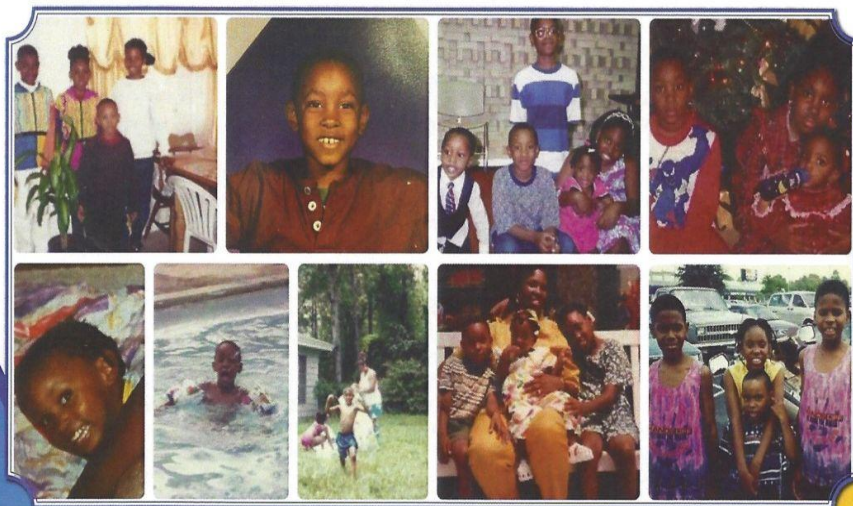

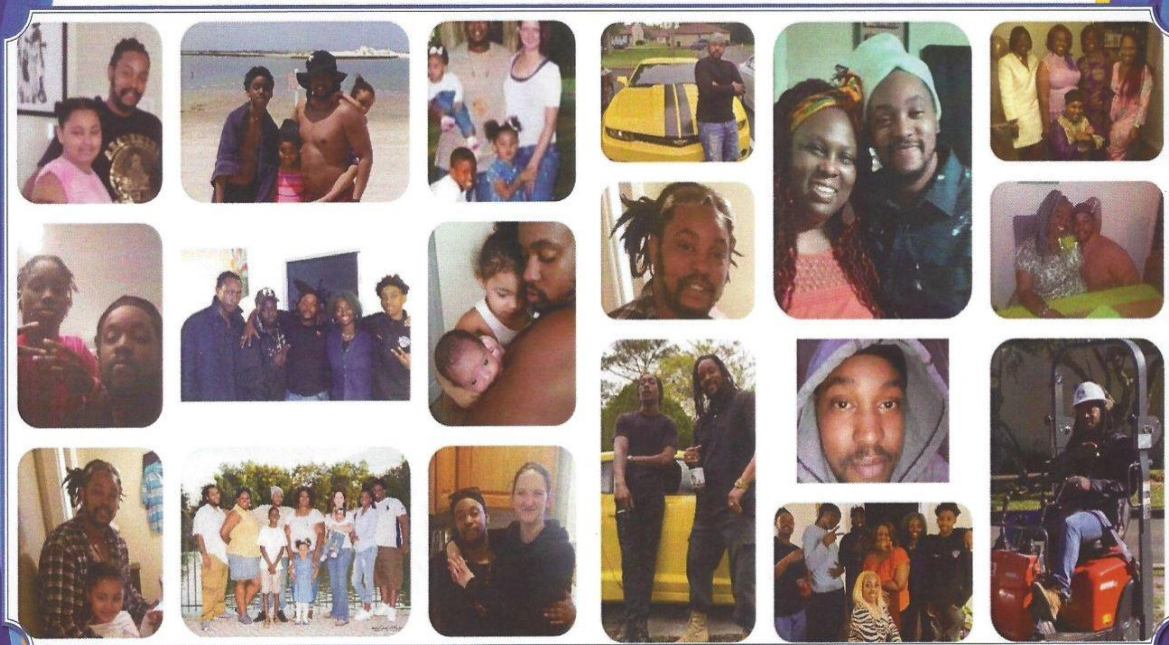

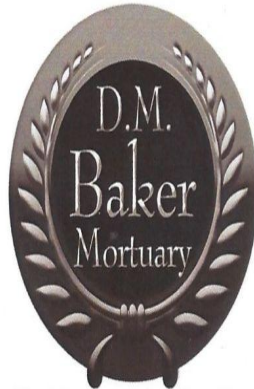
