And he will raise you up on eagle's wings, bear you on the breath of dawn, make you to shine like the sun, and hold you in the palm of his hand.

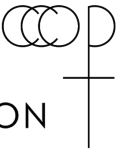
For to his angels he's given a command, to guard you in all of your ways; upon their hands they will bear you up, lest you dash your foot against a stone.
