While still a child, his parents learned the truth from door-to-door ministers of Jehovah. He had mentioned that as a very young boy he remembers two people coming to his family home. Because of the economic conditions of the times, the family moved often as they traveled up and down the west coast harvesting fruit crops. He left school in 9th grade to help in providing materially for the family. He never complained about having to do that. It was what was needed at the time and he was a strong young man able to work hard and help.

In time the family moved to Fresno where they purchased a small piece of property on the west side of town. The soil on the property was never good enough to farm but it was good enough to build two homes, one for his parents and one for his own family. Very soon after his marriage to Louise, he started to build, with his own hands, the house that he and the family would live in for several decades as they raised their family. As he cared for his family, what was most important to him was not material advantage but spiritual growth. He recognized that successful life was a life of devotion to Jehovah, not a life of material prosperity. This no doubt contributed to raising all four of their children to become worshippers of Jehovah.
